Funtley Village Society has re-formed to fight tooth and nail against the insane plan to build Welborne, an estate of 6,500 houses on prime agricultural land north of Funtley.

This sprawling urban conurbation will swallow up all the land between Funtley, north up to Wickham and west to Knowle village, an area the size of Petersheld.

Fareham Borough Council leader Sean Woodward and his planners have been touring with the Community Action Teams (CATs) for the past few years telling everyone that if we don't build Welborne then every pocket of green space between Fareham and Gosport will be of green space between Fareham and Gosport will be

filled by houses.

We, along with our fellow residents in Knowle, Wallington and Wickham, are vehemently against the building of Welborne and we are fighting Mr Woodward with every tool at our disposal. We have made small gains; we have got the originally proposed 10,000 houses cut to circa 6,500.
