

**A brief timeline of on going responses from Funtley Village Society (FVS) and Local Residents to the proposed Welborne Development previously known as the North of Fareham SDA (Strategic Development Area)**

<b>Oct 2003</b>	Publication of Revised South East Plan by the Labour Government
<b>2003/4</b>	SDA North of Fareham supported by PUSH (Partnership for Urban South Hampshire) which includes Fareham Borough Council (FBC) as part of the South East Plan
<b>Sept 2005</b>	Local residents start to organise action against SDA
<b>Nov 3<sup>rd</sup> 2005</b>	First public meeting re SDA held at Funtley Social Club. Cllr Séan Woodward, Mark Hoban MP, local councillors and over 80 residents attend
<b>May 24<sup>th</sup> 2006</b>	Public meeting at Funtley Social Club
<b>June 2006</b>	Detailed submission against the SDA submitted by FVS and local residents prior to Examination in Public (EiP)
<b>July 2006</b>	Examination in Public of draft South East Plan starts
<b>August 2007</b>	Publication on Panel Report on EiP. This in effects endorses the South East Plan
<b>2007/8 onwards</b>	Local communities (the Wickham Society, Knowle Village, Wallington, the Fareham Society, Funtley & CPRE Hants – Council for the Protection of Rural England) start to co-ordinate their opposition to the SDA via mutual co-operation and shared aims and objectives
<b>May 2010</b>	Election of Coalition Government. Review of South East Plan undertaken by the Government
<b>Jan 2011</b>	Detailed submission against the revised SDA plans and Core Strategy of FBC submitted by FVS and local residents. Online petition organised and written petition against the SDA with 194 Funtley residents' signatures, submitted to FBC
<b>June 2011</b>	Examination in Public held the Planning Inspectorate on the Core Strategy of FBC
<b>July 2011</b>	Planning Inspectorate declare the Core Strategy by FBC sound
<b>August 2011</b>	FBC adopt the Core Strategy as policy
<b>Sept 19<sup>th</sup> 2011</b>	Two public (CAT) meetings at Funtley Social Club. Cllr Séan Woodward presents the case for the SDA/Fareham Core Strategy amidst hostile questioning from Funtley Residents
<b>Sept 2011 to present</b>	Wide ranging 'consultation' on the Core Strategy starts involving all the stakeholders involved e.g. landowners, residents' groups,

	developers, local authorities, planning consultants, utility companies etc
<b>Sept 2012</b>	Welborne announced as the new name of the development
<b>June 2013</b>	Detailed submission against the draft Welborne Plan submitted by FVS and local residents
<b>Nov 18<sup>th</sup> 2013</b>	Public meeting at Funtley Social Club hosted by FVS
